## Our mission

To rescue horses who would not survive without our rescue, heal them and find them loving forever homes. We rescue horses who have been severely neglected, those destined for slaughter or with sporting/performance injuries that would otherwise be unnecessarily euthanised. To bring awareness to the plight of horses and to **meet them with kindness, awareness, gentleness and patience** so that they can enjoy interaction with and care from humans. To educate humans and bring awareness to kind, effective and consent based ways of being with horses, handling, training and where appropriate, riding horses so that adopters, and other people can find safe, effective and gentle ways to co-exist with horses.

## Our vision

To rescue as many horses as we can re-home and in achieving this, it is our intention to raise awareness for the plight of horses so as a society we can welcome gentle, kind ways of being with horses and say farewell to outdated, unkind and fear based horsemanship.

Our pillar stones are trust, kindness, freedom and magic. Building trust, offering kindness, giving the horses freedom to express themselves...and watching the magic happen as they transform emotionally and physically.

To share simple approaches to healing, husbandry and horse handling where the horse is listened to and a confident and willing partner.

For horses to be seen as the living, feeling beings they are - rather than objects, sporting equipment, or vehicles.

To have our own farm that is a paradise for horses and a haven for horses in need. A place for horses to heal and thrive whilst awaiting adoption homes. A place for humans to witness and learn kind, consent based horsemanship.

## Our History

The Kind Farm Inc. was established as a registered charity in May 2021. We did our first rescue in September 2021. From then on we have rescued horses who would otherwise have no one to turn to, healed them emotionally and physically and found them loving homes with kind humans.

The Kind Farm Inc. has continued to have wonderful health outcomes for horses in care and industry experts often comment on the healing that the horses have achieved in our care.



We are known for our horse-centred, kind, gentle and expert approach to healing and handling, as well as loving, expert care for as many horses as we can help at any given time.



## Section 1 - Overview of The Kind Farm Incorporated

### About Us

The Kind Farm Incorporated key focus is rescuing horses who would otherwise be slaughtered, die or be unnecessarily euthanised (usually from racing and sporting injury). We then rehabilitate horses until they are in a sound physical and emotional state and then find their fur-ever homes.

Many of the horses we rescue have been described by horse industry experts as highly traumatised, or not worth it. These horses need time, care, peace, expert handling and patience to learn to trust again and to be suitable for re-homing.

Often during the rescue journey horses bond with other horses for support and we do what it takes to find these horses loving homes together.

It is the work of The Kind Farm Inc. to keep horses in care until they are genuinely ready for a new home and ensure that the adopting home and humans are a great match long term for the horse/s.

### OUR OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Kind Farm Incorporated rescues horses who are destined for, or at risk of slaughter. The majority of horses rescued are from meat paddocks at large horse sale yards.

Meat paddocks are where unwanted horses stand until there are enough to send a large truck full to the knackery or horse slaughter house.

Horses are slaughtered for human consumption or as pet food. Their bodies are worth around \$400 depending on their weight/size/health. The horses we rescue all have issues whether it be health or behavioural issues. They are rarely ready for immediate re-homing.

The Kind Farm Inc establish relationships with horse meat traders and often purchase horses for the meat price.

We then arrange transport to safety and assess, rehabilitate and re-home horses. Often, due to the sale yard environment, horses are very traumatised on arrival. We then offer them feed, and care until they are healthy enough and confident enough to find a home.

'When re-homing we consider the best long term, forever homing options for each adopted horse/s. Ideally they are re-homed to experienced horse homes, where the adopters own their own property, there is great infrastructure including shelter, and the home is safe from flood and bushfire and drought.

Part of our strategy is to assist with transport to these homes, to make it possible for horses to live out their days on suitable properties in great horse country.

The adoption fee is always more than the horse is worth to a horse meat trader, to show commitment to that horses. We then conduct quarterly checks on adopted horses to make sure they are thriving in their new homes. Horses are re-homed under adoption agreement that prohibits the sale of the horse onwards unless under specific approval.

All male horses adopted our are gelded to prevent further breeding of horses. All mares are adopted out under agreement that they will never be bred from.

## Who we are

The Kind Farm Inc is made up of a team of people who realise that we can make the world a kinder place for horses. Most of our committee members pitch in to help with the physical care of the horses where needed.

We are all committed to the long term success of The Kind Farm Inc. so we can continue to rescue more and more horses and find their fur-ever homes. We pride ourselves on helping horses who are not easy to help - unhandled, highly traumatised and/or those who are not in good health.

Our pillar stones are kindness, love, gentleness, trust and freedom.

When a horse arrives we give everything to that horse in a way that supports their immediate and long term wellbeing. This may be in the form or nutrition and holistic foods, supplements, medicine or by touch and grooming that they enjoy. Horses are also paddocked in the most suitable environment, choosing suitable paddocks and companions to support them on their healing journey.

This kindness builds trust. We give them the freedom to be who they are - and do what they want to do at their own pace. We do not force them to be groomed or stabled if they do not want to be.

When a horse is offered kindness and freedom, they almost always engage with you when they are ready and trust has been built. From this point,

healing (both physical and emotional) takes a quantum leap and the magic happens. By magic we mean huge positive changes in temperament, confidence and health and wellbeing.

Everything in our approach is for the horses long term health and successful re-homing. Some horses need time and gentle training, whilst others need health care, maintenance and time and peace to build trust.

## **The Kind Farm Incorporated horses:**

### **Summary**

The 2024 - 2025 has been another wonderful year for horses at The Kind Farm Inc. thanks to the support of people kindly donating financially and with their time and expertise. Below is a summary of some of the positive progress and milestones throughout this year, along with a few things that didn't work as well for us.

### **A year in review - The Kind Farm Inc.**

### **The positives:**

**Horse trailer** - we were donated a custom made rescue trailer built for 1 large and small, handled and unhandled horses. Previously we were hiring or borrowing trailers to rescue and move horses.

**Donations** - both our regular and new donors grew in numbers and donations

**Community support** - more people offered us land to help the horses

**Hoof care** - we were blessed to find a hoof trimmer who uses the same handling approach that we use (consent and reward based handling). The horses have responded wonderfully and we now have ease at hoof trimming time meaning horses are happier and healthier. Lulu has also improved hoof trimming skills and can contribute directly to hoof care.

**Handling** - Lulu, helpers and volunteers attended courses and clinics and study to gain more skills to safely and effectively train and handle horses so they can have health care and thrive in the world.

**Book keeping** - we now have a trained book keeper keeping books in order for a very minimal fee.

**Shelters** - Thanks to funding from Global Ripple Inc. we built and improved shelters to keep horses comfortable and health in all weather.

**Paddock and fencing improvement** - we installed horse safe fencing and improved pastures through re-seeding and an intensive mowing program to improve grounds and create nourishing pasture and manage mud.

**Volunteers** - we have a small group of regular volunteers we are grateful to.

**Adoptions** - Spirit, Miss Thorin and Chance and other horses found loving, experienced forever homes.

**Tick management** - we raised and released Guinea Fowl to help control ticks and they play a wonderful part in The Kind Farm including their beautiful presence and almost eliminating ticks.

**Staff** - this year showed the very beginning of staff - not only to support Lulu, who has been feeding the horses for the larger part of 5 years, 7 days a week. The staffing is in alignment with fortifying The Kind Farm Inc. to ensure our legacy of love continues for horse.





### **Things that didn't work as we had expected:**

**Volunteers** - whilst we have welcomed some wonderful volunteers, we have not had many people who can attend regularly. The typical volunteer is either inexperienced (needing considerable resources to keep them safe and able to contribute), or attends once or twice only. When we consider the safety and induction/training time - only volunteers who attend regularly are a net positive to the horses. Also, being hosted on private land means we need to be mindful of privacy to residents.

**Visitors/Horse connection sessions** - we were delighted to have insurance granted to us by Demeter Legacy to explore visitors as a way to increase revenue and share the beauty of the horses with the community and our

supporters. The horses enjoy the interaction, however it became one more thing for Lulu to do and was not suited to the horses being on several different properties. We have decided to discontinue visitors/experiences/tours and focus on horses only for the time being.

**Adopting to inexperienced people** - we adopted out 4 horses who the people could not care for particularly in wet times and we brought these 4 horses back into care as we were not confident in their futures at these homes. We have adjusted our adoption criteria to ensure horses and homes are suitable in the future, particularly when considering wet weather facilities and ability/willingness to provide hoof care.

**Finding horses loving homes** - most adoption inquiries are asking for riding horses. Because of the nature of horses we help, these are rarely riding horses. Further to this, when people specifically want a riding horse, they are not likely to keep this horse forever. When a horse can no longer be ridden, many people want a new riding horse.

We have offered financial support and tuition to suitable homes. However adopting more horses into loving forever homes would be ideal.

Our purpose has always been to rescue horses who have no other hope. Horses destined for slaughter or neglected. These horses are often old, injured, unhandled, traumatised (making handling and care challenging due to extremely timid or defensive behaviour).

Put simply, we take the horses who have no value to humans - they can usually not be ridden or handled easily.



Horse professionals have often commented on the challenging nature of these horses we rescue.

To give these horses the care they need and get them ready for adoption homes takes time and expertise. It is not financially viable to employ a horse trainer, and even so, it would not be easy to find a training who would work with some of these horses.

This year we initiated our own training and handling approach and began working on a play space for horse training and learning. We are confident that this will make horses more appealing and likely to find adoption homes.

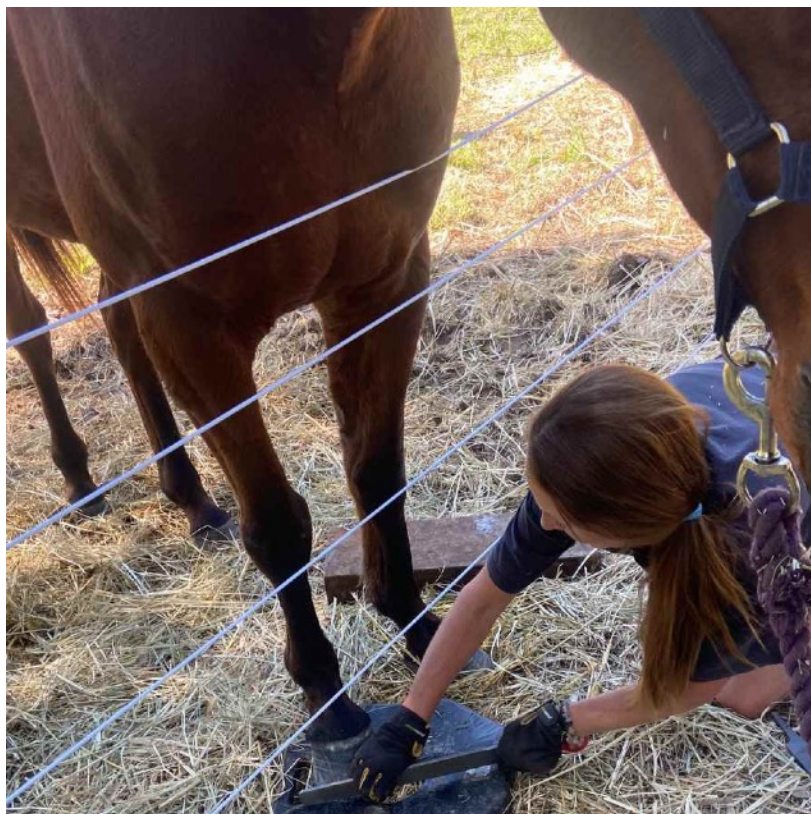

This year we continued to work with gentle practitioners including Alani Linklater for handling and hoof care and Matthew Munce for dental care. New equipment and skills has also allowed Lulu (Lucinda, President and primary horse carer) to assist with hoof trims and horse training.

### **HORSE INDUSTRY ASSISTANCE**

This year we furthered our skills by attending workshops, courses and clinics by Lockie Phillips - Emotional Horsemanship, Lisa Wiley from Free Rein Horsemanship and Nadine Lindblom liberty. We are also grateful for ongoing access to training resources by Connection Training.

## **COMMUNITY ASSISTANCE**

The Kind Farm Inc. has continued to be blessed by local land owners offering their land (often in exchange for paddock maintenance) to host the horses. Until we have our own equine property, this is a wonderful help to the horses.

## **CORPORATE ASSISTANCE** - training and expertise

We have been grateful to receive professional fund raising services and have been grateful to have this support to engage in profitable online fund raising. This has helped us build a group of supporters that continues to grow. Thanks to Cathy Blasonato, and to Leonard Coyne for your invaluable advice.

**AUSPICE ASSISTANCE** - Thank you to The Owl and Pussycat Farm Animal Sanctuary - a wonderful, well established sanctuary in the area, for your kind support in being an auspice for The Kind Farm Inc and letting us hire your truck.

## **Section 2 - Governance**

### **STRUCTURE & MANAGEMENT**

The Kind Farm Incorporated is an incorporated association registered in New South Wales, Australia. The Kind Farm Incorporated is a registered charity and complies with the requirements for a charity in Australia with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).

The Kind Farm Inc was first approved as a charity in May 2021, our first transaction was August 30th, 2021 and we rescued our first horse in September 2021.

## **Section 3 - Finances**

The Kind Farm Inc was registered as a charity on the 9th of May, 2021. Our first transaction was on 30th August, 2021.

The Kind Farm Inc. has operated at a slight profit for 2024 - 2025 financial year. Our donations were higher including the large donation for our horse trailer.

We had more horses in care and thanks to improved infrastructure and equipment, we are now providing an even higher quality of care to horses in

the way of paddock health, shelters, feed, supplementation and professional horse practitioners.

We are proud to have been able to provide rescue and rehabilitation to horses at an annual expense/cost similar to what many people spend on their healthy “pet” horses each year. We have now secured our own transport thanks to wonderful donors, making horse transport safer and more effective logistically and financially.

## **CHAIRPERSON’S REPORT**

The Kind Farm Inc was blessed to have such a stable and committed committee. All meetings were well attended and very productive, reflecting the committee sharing the clear vision of The Kind Farm Inc. For a young charity, I am very satisfied in the professional and aligned way The Kind Farm Inc is operating and progressing.

## **PRESIDENT’S REPORT**

The 2024/2025 has been a wonderful year for The Kind Farm Inc. The rescue trailer has been an enormous help in smooth and timely rescue of horses. The shelters have made the horses much more comfortable and healthier due to having dry ground to stand on. Aside from the improvement in equipment, we have been able to bring together a small team who are in alignment with our rescue and care, bringing the horses faster learning and greater ease with hoof care and handling.

I am so grateful to every supporter helping more horses to have a kind and loving chapter in life.

## **TREASURER’S REPORT**

This year has been a productive year for The Kind Farm Incorporated (TKF Inc.) with a significant increase in donations. Although the P&L reports show our Gross Profit was \$148187 and the Operating Expenses totalled \$149971 leaving a loss of (\$1784), the cash flow report shows that we are running slightly above break even, with the cash and cash equivalents at end of the period being \$4933. It was our objective to raise more funds from our regular donors and this goal was achieved.

There was also a significant increase in overall donations from new donors.

TKF Inc. operates with most expenses funded at the time of purchase. We seek to deliver exceptional care to neglected horses, and this is precisely what we do by raising funds to care for those horses, in a very practical way, on a daily basis. As we continue to get more supporters and donations, it will be appropriate to accumulate funds for more equipment and facilities, however for this financial year, horse health and wellbeing was the priority, and all funds were allocated to that end.

Since we are in our third year and have witnessed a steady rise in support and income from donations, we now have the financial fortitude to better predict cash flow and our performance has given our small group of regular supporters the confidence to contribute funds when requested, for expenses that are not our usual outgoings. Such as funding specialised transport for an urgent rescue.

This year has marked a milestone in TKF Inc's growth where we are now required to register for GST. The next milestone we intend to achieve by 2027 is the status of a medium sized charity.

# **The Kind Farm Inc.**

## **Financial Report 1st July 2024 – 30th June 2025**

### **FINANCIAL REPORT**

This following financial report is also included in The Kind Farm Incorporated's 2025 Annual Report.

#### **Introduction**

The Kind Farm Inc has been operating as a registered charity for four financial years successfully rescuing horses who have been neglected, or at risk of slaughter or otherwise at risk of death/unnecessary euthanasia.

This financial report encompasses our fourth financial year of operations.

#### **Principal Activities**

The Kind Farm Inc rescues horses who are marked for slaughter, or at risk of slaughter, neglected or face unnecessary euthanasia from sports/racing injury.

We rehabilitate them, retrain where necessary and re-home them into suitable and loving adoption homes. Through our activities we also educate the general public about responsible horse ownership and kind, gentle and effective training methods.

#### **Significant changes**

The Kind Farm Inc was registered in May 2021, starting operations in September 2021. There have been no significant changes for The Kind Farm Inc.

#### **Going Concern**

This financial report has been prepared on a going concern basis that expects to continue operations and the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities as ordinary course of operations. The ability of the association to continue to operate as a going concern is dependent upon the ability of the association to generate sufficient cash flows from operations to meet its liabilities. We continue to grow in

our donors and donations and also have members of the public who have pledged to offer more donations on request, should they be needed. The members of the association believe that the going concern assumption is appropriate.

### **Operation result - financial year 1 July 2024 - 30th June 2025**

For ease in reading reports, we have chosen to no longer include decimals.

**Profit** AUD 33,070 \*

**Total equity 30 June 2024** AUD 32,839

\* The surplus reported in the Profit and Loss Report is primarily attributable to restricted donations received for the acquisition of a horse trailer, amounting to AUD 30,800. In line with Australian accounting standards and ACNC reporting principles, the horse trailer has been recognised as a capital asset rather than a direct expense, as it is owned by the charity and provides ongoing benefit over multiple financial periods. As such, the cost of the asset will be expensed progressively through depreciation over its estimated useful life.

This accounting treatment results in the donation being fully recognised as income in the current reporting period, while the associated expense impact is deferred, temporarily increasing the reported surplus. The surplus does not represent unrestricted profit or excess operational income.

### **Reportable related party transactions in the 2024 - 2025 reporting period**

A figure of \$23,777 paid to President Lucy Scarman for contracted hands on care of the horses approximately 8 hours a day, 7 days a week, 330 days of the year. This is a heavily discounted figure to reflect keeping the horses and the charity healthy. This is included in the "Income and Expenses by Contact" report under "General Horse Care contractor". Contractor fees were paid direct to Lucy in the earlier part of the year and then through her animal care and training business Animal Wisdom ABN 13764654598.

A figure of \$611 paid to Coco Best - daughter of President, for paddock maintenance including manure picking and brush cutting fence lines. This is included in the "Income and Expenses by Contact" report under "Trades People and Labourers".

### **Note on financial statements**

The Kind Farm Inc. was approved as a charity in May 2021. This financial statement represents the fourth full financial year of operations.

The Kind Farm Incorporated is an incorporated association registered in New South Wales, Australia. The Kind Farm Incorporated is a registered charity and complies with the requirements for a charity in Australia with with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).

The Kind Farm Inc financial statements and reports use the accrual system of accounting.

The Kind Farm Inc responsible persons are in agreement that this financial report represents an accurate and true record of operations of The Kind Farm Inc.
