Our mission

Our vision

To become a world wide horse rescue network rescuing individual horses, and finding them loving, forever homes. In achieving this it is our intention to raise awareness for the plight of horses and educating people on how to be with horses in a safe and kind way.

Our pillar stones are trust, kindness, freedom and magic. Building trust, offering kindness, giving the horses freedom to express themselves...and watching the magic happen as they transform emotionally and physically.

To offer both experience and inexperienced humans the opportunity to connect with, and care for horses in a way that is insightful, connected, gentle, safe and fulfilling for both the horses/ and human/s.

Our History

The kind farm inc was established as a registered charity in May 2021. We did our first rescue in September 2022 - the horses was called Hero and we used our friends and local community to raise funds.

Our first rescue where we reached out to the broader community was in December 2021. It was this rescue of Spirit and Sephira that inspired us to be able to rescue more horses. We could see that between people willing to donate money and resources, including land, that we would be able to help many horses.

Through out 2022 we continue to rescue horses who would've otherwise been slaughtered. We established relationships with horse traders and purchased horses for the pet food price, who would have otherwise been slaughtered. Throughout the year we rescued a further 14 horses, 7 of who have been re-homed.

The horses we rescued were mostly destined for the horrible knackery on the Sunshine Coast - featured years ago on the ABC network in Australia.

It has been a big learning year and we have experienced some unusual weather. At the current time the kind farm are concentrating on rehoming horses and building a better infrastructure so we can rehabilitate and bring home the faster and therefore save more forces.

Section 1 - Overview of The Kind Farm Incorporated

About Us

The Kind Farm Incorporated key focus is rescuing horses who would otherwise be slaughtered. We then rehabilitate horses until they are in a sound physical and emotional state and then find their fur-ever homes.

Many of the horses we rescue have been described by horse industry experts as highly traumatised. These horses need time, care, peace, expert handling and patience to learn to trust again and to be suitable for re-homing.

Often during the rescue journey horses bond with other horses for support and we do what it takes to find these horses loving homes together.

It is the work of the kind farm inc to keep horses in care until they are genuinely ready for a new home and ensure that the adopting home and humans are a great match long term for the horse/s.

Who we are

The Kind Farm Inc is made up of a team of people who realise that we can make the world a kinder place for horses. Most of our committee members pitch in to help with the physical care of the horses where needed.

We are all committed to the long term success of The Kind Farm Inc so we can continue to rescue more and more horses and find their fur-ever homes.

We pride ourselves on helping horses who are not easy to help - unhandled, highly traumatised and/or those who are not in good health. Our motto is kindness, trust, freedom and magic. When a horse arrives we give, give, give to that horse in a way that supports their immediate and long term wellbeing. This may be in the form of nutrition and holistic foods, supplements, medicine or by touch and grooming that they enjoy.

This kindness builds trust. We give them the freedom to be who they are - and do what they want to do at their own pace. We do not force them to be groomed or stabled if they do not want to be.

When a horse is offered kindness and freedom, they almost always engage with you when they are ready and trust has been built. From this point, healing (both physical and emotional) takes a quantum leap and the magic happens. By magic we mean huge positive changes in temperament, confidence and health and wellbeing.

Everything in our approach is for the horses long term health and successful re-homing. Some horses need time and gentle training, whilst others need health care, maintenance and time and peace to build trust.



The Kind Farm Incorporated horses:

Summary

Since we began operating in September 2021, we have rescued 19 horses and re-homed 7 of them. This year we are focusing on rehoming horses, creating a better facility and being able to pay for staff to help with training and retraining horses who are unhandled and traumatised.

Spirit - rescued as a young horse, unhandled and aggressive. He is now a sweet, confident horse in care and is undergoing basic training. Spirit is awaiting self gelding before being rehomed. Due to having no descended testicles, this could be an unsafe operation - we have been offering him time and treatment and have already had one testicle descend. He is under observation with the hopes he can have a straight forward castration.

Sephira - This beautiful horse was rescued with Spirit and was severely neglected. We are not sure if she was Spirit's mother, however sadly, she did not survive and was euthanised after a fall. She was in such poor condition that she could not easily rest lying down, and get back up. In the first 10 days of care she consistently gained weight, however she was so severely neglected that her muscles could not support her body. Rest in peace beautiful Sephira.

Aslan (rescued as Danny) - Aslan arrived as an emaciated young horse who was very timid and traumatised. He had ingested plastic which came out in his manure for days. He is now thriving and after a difficult gelding, typical of a traumatised horse, he has again become very timid. This year Aslan will continue gentle training until he is ready for his forever home. Aslan was rescued with Sox and they are best friends.

Sox narrowly escaped slaughter, being an unwanted, unhandled colt. He arrived timid, with Aslan, and then quickly began to thrive and find his way in the herd. Sox is continuing gentle training and is still a young horse. He is now the leader of his herd of 6. We will do what it takes to have Sox and Aslan find a loving home together.



ARWEN



Prince Caspian came to The Kind Farm Inc in an unusual way - he was in the unpenning section at a horse auction and listed as a much larger horse. We bid the meat price remotely and on arrival found he was a miniature stallion. The auction house acknowledged the listing error and offered to take him back, however we decided he had been through enough and he stayed on, winning everyone's hearts. Prince Caspian has since been gelded and found a loving fur-ever home.

Arthur was a last chance rescue from a sale yard - a young standard bred horse. He arrived extremely timid though from what we gather he was not raced or ridden. Due to his very timid nature, we wonder whether he had a training accident and was discarded as he was too frightened to continue training. Either way, we have loved watching Arthur settle in and get confident in his herd. Arthur has had gentle training, which will continue, to give him the best chance at a loving, fur-ever home. Being a young horse, his training is so important to ensure the best chance at a great life.

Thor is an ex raced horse and came to us highly traumatised from ropes and very aggressive to the other horses. He quickly became quite affection for a brush and pat around his face and front, however it has taken months for Thor to become peaceful and confident to be caught and led. Thor is the kind of horse most people would not bother with as he needs so much attention and expertise. We are confident Thor will continue to settle and learn how to be a loving companion to someone and find a home this year.

Guinevere is an ex racehorse from a prestigious stud/breeder who arrived with her teeth so sharp she could barely chew and eat properly. She also had some signs of previous injury. She was extremely head shy when she arrived and very nervous - most likely from previous rough handling. She quickly became a very gracious horse at the kind farm and captured the hearts of the people who helped her. Guinevere has now been adopted with Freya and is living in an idyllic new home with a wonderful, loving human.

Freya arrived to us in average condition and narrowly escaped slaughter and the gruelling trip to a horse slaughterhouse. She is a huge standardbred and was so dejected when she arrived...it really felt like she had never been loved or treated kindly. After a few weeks in care she began to shine and realise we were here to help. She is now living her best life with Guinevere in a lovely fur-ever home.

Frankie is a white miniature horse who was washed away with his best friend in the 2016 Northern NSW floods. Although Frankie survived, his friend did not make it and he was traumatised and could never be caught or handled from this Tim onwards. His property was flooded again in 2022 and his owners needed to move on. Frankie was caught and transported safely to The Kind Farm Inc and has now been castrated and is slowly learning to trust again.

Nova is a standardbred mare who was in a last chance saleyard with Juno. We raised funds for her rescue and transport to safety and she is adopted directly into a lovely, experienced home.

River arrived with a bowed knee and overgrown hoof. He is an ex-trotting/racing horse who had no name, and no racing history. He is 22 years of age and was extremely traumatised and defensive when he arrived. With patience and expert handling and health treatment, River is almost ready for his new forever home as a companion. River is calm, gentle and easy to catch, lead and have his teeth cared for. He is not a riding horse.

Hope arrived as the most timid horse we had ever experienced - she is still finding her way in the herd and is best friends with Faith. She is fond of apples and now confident to walk into a yard herself, however very unsure when it comes to being caught and handled.

Faith is an ex harness racing horse who was used as a breeding mare. She arrived very traumatised - she could not go in a yard or wear a halter or be caught or touched without panicking. Today she is thriving other than an eye condition which we are treating with some success.

Arwen arrived with no vision in one eye, her other eye cut and a wound in her face so septic we were relieved she could be treated in time to clear the infection. Arwen has now found a loving home out in the Dubbo area along with another rescued horse. We noted from Arwen's ban that she was bred in a prestigious thoroughbred stud in the Scone area. Arwen did not have any closer friends at The Kind Farm Inc and happily boarded her truck off to her new home and has settled in well and even has some vision back in her eye and her other eye has healed completely.

Merlin arrived with Magic, Thor and Freya. Merlin, like so many gray horses, has melanoma on his neck and ear. It looked as though he had been a working station horse who was rejected as he could not be ridden with the melanoma. He was very timid and defensive when he arrived and very stressed. Today Merlin is having a nice time with Magic and ready for his loving new home in an area where he and Magic are free from itch.

Magic was a horse who we were told comes out of a rodeo/competition setting. He arrived in poor condition, riddled with parasites. He could barely walk due to seized shoulders and hips. He was extremely timid -

even lifting a hand to brush or catch him and Magic would flinch or run away. Magic has Merlin as a best friend and has improved in condition substantially, only now he has summer itch. He is ready for a forever home out west (out of itch country) with his dear friend Merlin.

Wildheart is a brumby, we are told he was rescued from the wild when his mother was killed in a horse cull. He was adopted and due to his human's health condition, he was then passed on to another few owners. Wildheart has been in our part care so he can stay on the property he is at home with and live out his life there.

Diamond is the wild child of the herd who has only just become trusting enough to wear a halter. Diamond is the calm leader of her band of horses and is tough and wary, yet sweet when she feels confident.

Dae Dae was rescued as a young horse who was marked for slaughter, along with Diamond. She is a sweet little horse and we are taking care of her and hope one day she can find a human to care for her.

Hero is an off the track thoroughbred who was surrendered and at risk of slaughter (selling for \$200 on gumtree). He had choke, was windsucking and his teeth were almost worn out. Hero has been adopted out to the person who first made us aware of his plight.

Highlight of the year:

Arwen was found unwanted in a saleyard, blind in one eye and the other eye cut. She arrived terrified, traumatised and with a septic face from infected injury. She was from a prestigious racing stud and it was clear she had been once well cared for by her trimmed tail and sweet nature.

She required intensive treatment and was always most obliging and gracious. After months in care she had regained vision in both eyes and was adopted out to a lovely human out west.

Arwen arrived to her glorious new home on Melbourne cup day. A wonderful outcome for a horse who almost didn't make it to know a kind chapter in her life.

OUR SUPPORTERS

Section 2 - Governance

STRUCTURE & MANAGEMENT

The Kind Farm Incorporated is an incorporated association registered in New South Wales, Australia. The Kind Farm Incorporated is a registered charity and complies with the requirements for a charity in Australia with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission (ACNC).

The Kind Farm Inc was first approved as a charity in May 2021, our first transaction was August 30th, 2021 and we rescued our first horse in September 2021.

Section 3 - Finances

The Kind Farm Inc was registered as a charity on the 9th of May, 2021. Our first transaction was on 30th August, 2021, therefore the accounting year 1st July 2020 - 30th June 2021 had no transactions and is not included in this report.

The Kind Farm Inc has operated at a slight profit. We have had the confidence to take on rescues due to the kind offers of two supporters to donate more fund should we need it. It is expected that, over the years to come, our fundraising expenses will be a much lower percentage of donations received as we will continue to build a loyal and support following.

We are proud to have been able to provide rescue and rehabilitation to horses at an annual expense/cost similar to what many people spend on their healthy "pet" horses each year. As we secure our own transport we will be even more effective in our rescue and rehoming costs.

CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Throughout challenges including lockdowns and border closures, we were happy to have above the necessary attendance at all meetings. Our meetings were held with an "in person" and remote video conferencing attendance option via zoom.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The first year of The Kind Farm Inc has been an incredible success. The horses we have re-homed, and those still in care have inspired us to do what it takes to keep rescuing and retraining horses.

The support we have had, mostly from individuals on social media, has truly made this possible and the generosity of local land holders and horse experts has greatly enhanced the operations.

Over the year we had the moments of despair and sadness that come with animal rescue...and this fuels us with an even greater desire to offer as much kindness and awareness to horses that we possibly can.

It's been a huge effort in rescue with many lessons learned. At our most we had 20 horses in care.

There are too many horses to mention in this report, however we saw the beautiful ex racehorse Arwen recover vision in her eye and find a loving home. We saw unhandled and very traumatised horses become the most confident, loving horses we have ever met. We stayed safe in the floods and completed rescues of traumatised and defensive horses and helped them realise that life can be good and humans can be kind.

Through our commitment to long term health, as well as immediate wellbeing, we saw our care, including nutrition plan, carry most of the horses healthily through rather adverse weather.

We saw the patience and calmness of our training and handling reward us and the horses with a safe and enjoyable environment.

In summary it has been a huge first year and I am delighted with this year and excited for the future to come.

There have been so many people contribute to the horse rescues.

OUR OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The Kind Farm Incorporated rescues horses who are destined for, or at risk of slaughter. The majority of horses rescued are from meat paddocks at large horse sale yards.

Meat paddocks are where unwanted horses stand until there are enough to send a large truck full to the knackery or horse slaughter house.

Horses are slaughtered for human consumption or as pet food. Their bodies are worth around \$400 depending on their weight/size/health. The horses we rescue all have issues whether it be health or behavioural issues. They are rarely ready for immediate re-homing.

The Kind Farm Inc establish relationships with horse meat traders and often purchase horses for the meat price.

We then arrange transport to safety and assess, rehabilitate and re-home horses. Often, due to the sale yard environment, horses are very traumatised on arrival. We then offer them feed, and care until they are healthy enough and confident enough to find a home.

‘When re-homing we consider the best long term, forever homing options for each adopted horse/s. Ideally they are re-homed to experienced horse homes, where the adopters own their own property, there is great infrastructure including shelter, and the home is safe from flood and bushfire and drought.

Part of our strategy is to assist with transport to these homes, to make it possible for horses to live out their days on suitable properties in great horse country.

The adoption fee is always more than the horse is worth to a horse meat trader, to show commitment to that horses. We then conduct quarterly checks on adopted horses to make sure they are thriving in their new homes. Horses are re-homed under adoption agreement that prohibits the sale of the horse onwards unless under specific approval.

All male horses adopted our are gelded to prevent further breeding of horses. All mares are adopted out under agreement that they will never be bred from.

TREASURER'S REPORT

I am happy to report that The Kind Farm Incorporated is in good financial standing. As a further note to the financial statements below, we are blessed to have the ongoing support of a couple of individuals who have offered to contribute further where needed.

This provides a safety net to continue with operations with confidence. Starting as a charity, we have had a higher percentage of fundraising costs than we anticipate in the future, however this has been a necessary cost in getting The Kind Farm Inc horse rescue started. FINANCIAL REPORT

Introduction

The Kind Farm Inc is a new charity with the purpose of rescuing horses who would otherwise be slaughtered or at risk of slaughter. This financial report encompasses our initial year of operations.

Principal Activities

The Kind Farm Inc rescues horses who are en route to slaughter or at risk of slaughter. We rehabilitate them, retrain where necessary and re-home them into adoption homes. Through our activities we also educate the general public about responsible horse ownership.

Significant changes

The Kind Farm Inc was registered in May 2021, starting operations in September 2021. There have been no significant changes for The Kind Farm Inc.

Going Concern

This financial report has been prepared on a going concern basis that expects to continue operations and the realisation of assets and settlement of liabilities as ordinary course of operations. The ability of the association to continue to operate as align concern is dependent upon the ability of the association to generate sufficient cash flows from operations to meet its liabilities. We also have members of the public who have pledged to offer more donations on request, should they be needed. The members of the association believe that the going concern assumption is appropriate.

LOOKING TO THE FUTURE

The pillar stones of The Kind Farm Inc. horse rescue are donations, rescues, rehabilitation and re-homing.

Our overall goal is to rescue as many horses from slaughter and neglect as possible, rehabilitate them into good health - considering their immediate and long term physical and emotional wellbeing, and find them for ever homes.

To achieve this we will continue to attract donations, build better facilities that will safeguard us from challenging weather and employ carers so we can have more horses rehabilitated, and have them ready for loving homes sooner, where possible.

Over the previous year, our rehabilitation and re-training has been impacted by adverse weather. With an indoor or under cover facility we can continue to progress in all weather.

As we grow as a charity, we will raise funds for our own transport which will allow us to rescue horses in a safer way and time frame and also reduce initial transport costs and make re-homing possible to a broader array of homes.

We will continue to keep bonded horses together where this is the best outcome for the horses and continue with our trust based gentle training to ensure horses and their adopting humans the safest and most enjoyable life together.

We anticipate that in the coming year, we will be offering comprehensive connection based training to horses and the people who adopt them. By offering our own style of training, suited to rescued horses, we expect to offer horses to people who can also be trained in this method - this will empower people to interact with horses in a very gentle, safe and insightful way - ultimately achieving our objectives of the best outcome for both the individual horses we rescue, and horses at large.

For further donations we will look to establish horse connection workshops and sessions as well as opportunity for people to donate to come and meet the horses.

The caveat to all human interaction with horses is that it is in the best interests of each individual horse.

Whilst we have had some help from larger organisations, the key to our fund raising has been kind individuals who have donated either once off or regularly to the rescue and care for the horses.
